

Locally REmade Consigner FAQs

How are items determined to be suitable for consignment?

Items must be both upcycled and handmade, showcasing creativity and originality while aligning with our focus on sustainability and creative reuse. We avoid consigning items similar to those already in the store, and items made entirely from pre-bought kits will not be accepted. High-quality craftsmanship is essential, with well-made items that demonstrate attention to detail and safety/appropriateness for customers of all ages. We prioritize items created by local artists using local materials, and artists who actively promote their work will receive preference in the selection process.

How many items/what kind of items do you accept?

Due to our limited space, items must be manageable in size, with anything larger than a tote bag that can't be folded potentially not being accepted. Having a consistent theme or style within your collection helps create a visually appealing display and increases your chances of approval. We welcome a variety of upcycled items, including small home decor, fashion accessories, and functional items made from repurposed materials, so get creative with your submissions!

What is the suggested price point for Locally REmade items?

It is important that items are reasonably priced to encourage sales and attract a broad customer base. Historically, we have had the most success with items that are between \$5-\$35 range, but will consider higher priced items if they fit the criteria of selection.

What are the terms for artists who want to consign their work at Resource Depot?

Artists interested in consigning their work must agree to a commission rate of 60% to the artist and 40% to Resource Depot which supports our arts and education programs. Resource Depot staff will take care to protect your items, but we do not provide insurance. Additionally, by consigning you are giving Resource Depot permission to use photographs of your work for promotional purposes.

How long are items on consignment?

To keep the store fresh and engaging for customers, artists and/or items will be rotated on a regular basis. The consignment periods are: October 1 - January 31, February 1 - May 30, and June 1 - September 30. No work may be removed or added during the consignment period by the artist, unless initiated by Resource Depot.

What happens when I sell something?

Inventory is reconciled monthly and at the end of each consignment period. Checks are issued within 5-7 business days after the end of the consignment period. Sales tax will be collected and remitted by Resource Depot.
